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Black History Month: Whitney Young



For Black History Month it seemed like a good idea to remember one of Black History's unsung heroes, Whitney Young Jr. (July 31, 1921 – March 11, 1971). Although he marched in and took part in the rights movement, he was outside of its mainstream. Working tirelessly behind the scenes, he spent most of his career working to end employment

discrimination in the United States. He also succeeded in taking The National Urban League from a relatively passive civil rights organization into one that aggressively worked for equitable access to socioeconomic opportunity for the historically disenfranchised.

Mr. Young spent his tenure as President of the National Association of Social Workers--NASW ensuring that the profession kept pace with the troubling social and human challenges it was facing. NASW news articles document his call to action for social workers to address social welfare through poverty reduction, race reconciliation, and putting an end to the Vietnam War.

The list of his achievements is impressive and seemingly endless. For more information about this towering Civil Rights leader, please look him up on Wikipedia. You won't be disappointed.

While giving Whitney Young's eulogy President Richard Nixon commented "He knew how to accomplish what other people were merely for." Young's work was instrumental in breaking down the barriers of segregation and inequality that held back African Americans.

The story of Valentine's Day began in the third century with an oppressive Roman Emperor, Claudius II Gothicus, and Valentinus, a kind hearted Christian priest, who was imprisoned for helping others who were at the mercy of the Emperor's decree. Realizing the injustice of the decree, Valentinus defied Claudius, and performed marriages for young lovers in secret. Upon discovering this, Claudius sentenced him to death.

Every February 14th across the Unit- During the last weeks of Valentine's ed States, and in other places around life a remarkable thing happened. He fell in love with a young blind girl who visited him during his confinement. Before his death it is alleged that he wrote her a letter signed "From your Valentine," an expression that is still used today. Alabama, with its viscious racists.... one day right there in Alabama little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers.

I have a dream today.

I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, and every hill and mountain shall be made low; the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight; and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together.

This is our hope. This is the faith that I go back to the South with. With this faith we will be able to hew out of the mountain of despair a stone of hope. With this faith we will be able to transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brother-

hood. With this faith we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to go to jail together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will be free one day. Henry Ford Museum Outing

We, the Visions Clubhouse members, have the opportunity to go on many outings. One of them was our trip to the Henry Ford Museum. It was I/I5, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day. Cheryl M., Shanel L., Derrick B., Michael C., Corina C., were picked up by April, and Howard picked up David L., Ryan W., Julie E., Darlene W., and Curtis M.

The museum was founded by automobile industrialist Henry Ford, and based on his efforts to preserve items of historical interest and portray the Industrial Revolution. It stretches over 523,000 square feet of hardwood floors. In the hallways the ceilings are decorated, and there are many beautiful chandeliers.

We split off into smaller groups to view the exhibits, and saw different kinds of machinery, steam engines, and equipment for generating power. There is a big collection of cars.

The agricultural exhibit illustrated how crops were grown and harvested at different times in history.

There were tractors, farm equipment, campers/RVs, computers, timelines, engines, trains, and oil equipment. We also saw furniture, and how kitchens changed over time.

The airplane artifacts offered us a journey through aviation's first decades. Among these was a replica of the world's very first airplane. It was invented, built, and flown by the Wright brothers. The airplane was not one invention, but many inventions that all needed to work in concert for the machine to be successful. The Wright flyer flew for the first time at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, on December 17, 1903. We also saw the first airplane, the 1925 Fokker Trimotor, that was flown over the North Pole by Richard Byrd. We also learned about the wing walkers, acrobats that were moving on the wings of an airplane during flight in the 1920s.

After a good walk through the museum we all met up in one of the dining rooms for tasty treats and beverages. We went home with many good memories, having a good idea of how people lived at the dawn of the automobile and plane era.
